SUCCESSFUL END TO LEGISLATIVE SESSION FOR GOVERNOR ...

- Fiscal Year 2020 State Budget Signed Into Law... With bipartisan support, in both the House and Senate, a \$40 billion FY2020 budget was approved; and, on June 5, 2019 signed into law by Governor Pritzker. Budget becomes effective July 1, 2019.
 - <u>Senate Bill 689</u> Revenue component of budget (Public Act 101-0009) <u>Senate Bill 262</u> – Budget spending authorization bill (Public Act 101-0007) <u>Senate Bill 1814</u> – Budget Implementation Bill (BIMP) (Public Act 101-0010) Effective date is July 1, 2019 for FY2020 Budget.
- Capital Infrastructure Plan Approved ... \$45.6 billion capital infrastructure package approved by both chambers for vertical (building construction) and horizontal (construction of roads/bridges) projects.
 - <u>Senate Bill 690</u> Raises revenues for vertical infrastructure/expands gaming; raises sales tax revenues for local governments from other state tax sources (also SB689)
 - <u>Senate Bill 1939</u> Contains revenue sources for horizontal/transportation infrastructure; includes increase in motor fuel tax by 19 cents per gallon (effective July 1, 2019)
 - <u>Senate Bill 689</u> Identifies revenue sources to support operating budget spending priorities; raises sales tax revenues for local governments from other state tax sources (also SB690) (Public Act 101-0009 Effective June 5, 2019) <u>House Bill 142</u> Issues general obligation bonds for capital projects and to assist in payment of backlog of state's unpaid bills <u>House Bill 62</u> Capital spending bill
- Recreational Cannabis Legalization Approved ... Lawmakers gave their approval to legalize the sale and use of recreational cannabis for residents 21 and older.
 - Public Act 101-0027 ... The Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act.
- Senate Joint Resolution Constitutional Amendment 1 Signed Into Law ... Voters in the November 2020 General Election will decide whether to change how the state income tax is levied, following approval by the General Assembly of SJRCA-1; and, subsequent signing into law by the Governor on June 5, 2019. The language on the ballot will ask voters to allow any type of income tax ... graduated, non-graduated or a combination of both. Currently, it is what is deemed a 'flat tax' ... all personal income levels pay the same percent. Approval to change would require a majority of those voting in the general election to vote in favor; or, 60% of those who vote on the specific amendatory language.
- <u>Senate Bill 687</u>, which establishes the new income tax rates that will be imposed if the Constitutional Amendment (*SJRCA-1*) is approved by voters in November 2020, was also approved by the General Assembly. (Public Act 101-0008)
